

# Sailing to a New Horizon



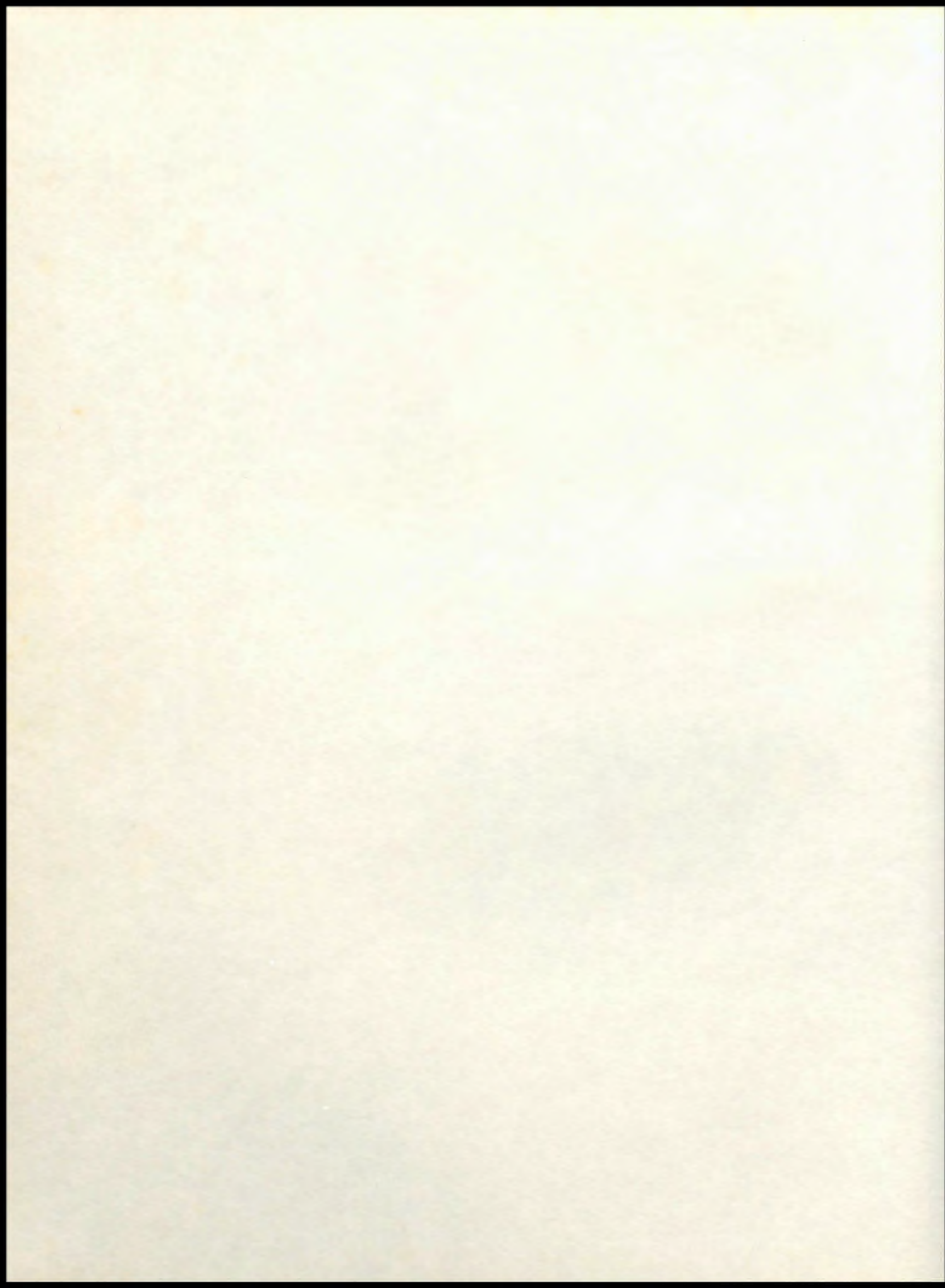

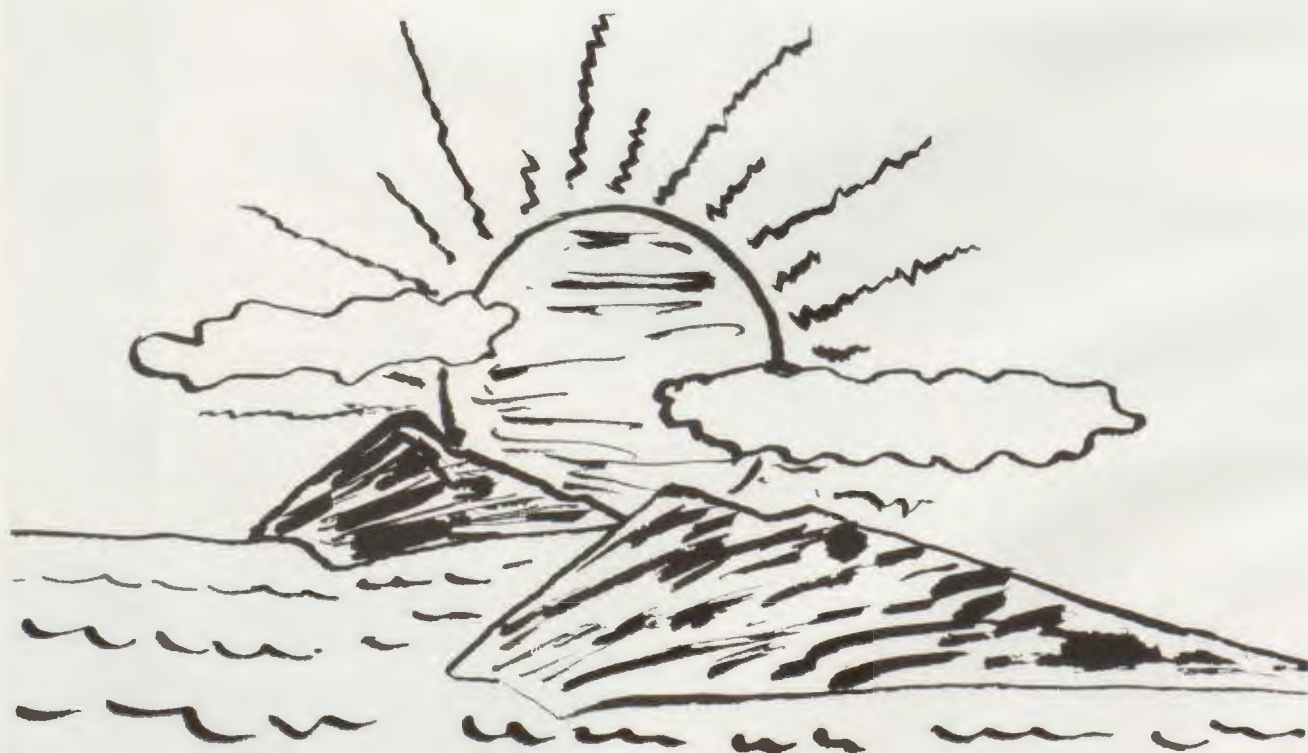

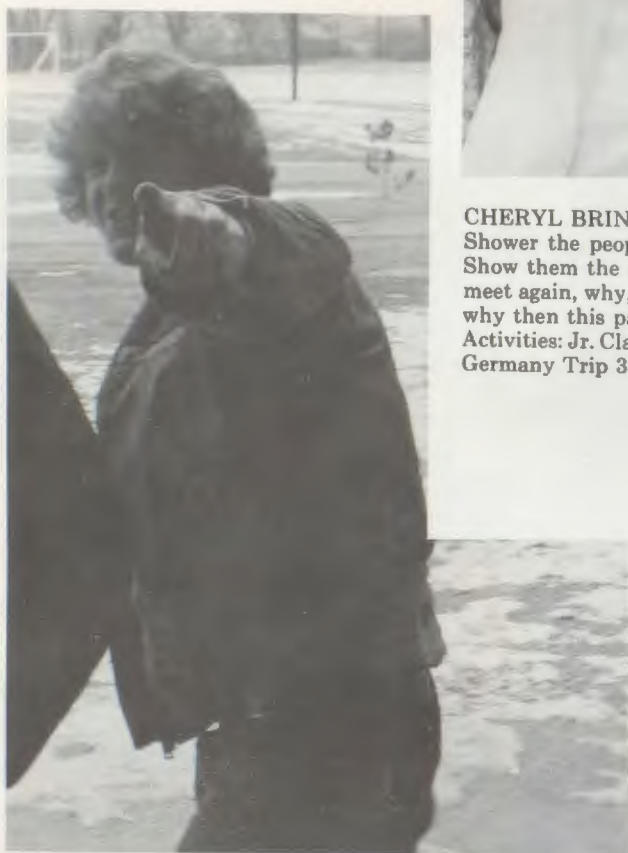

## THE VARSITY SOCCER TEAM IS



Key starters A. Messinger and J. O'Brien were absent half of the regular season due to ankle injuries. Near the end of the season T. Angier and goal keeper T. Bicknell were also critically injured. Rather than submit to these adversities the team responded with a fine 5-6-3 record.

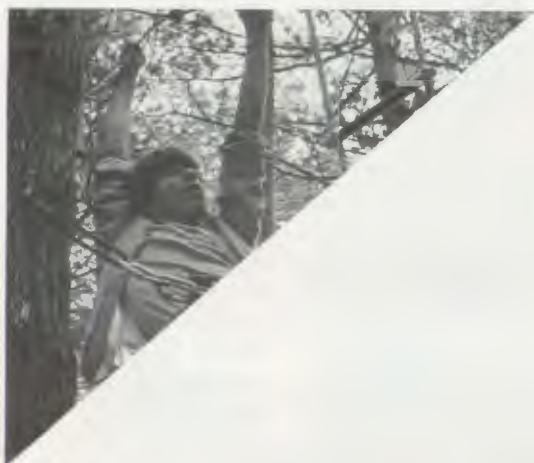


## "PLAYBOY OF THE WESTERN WORLD"
