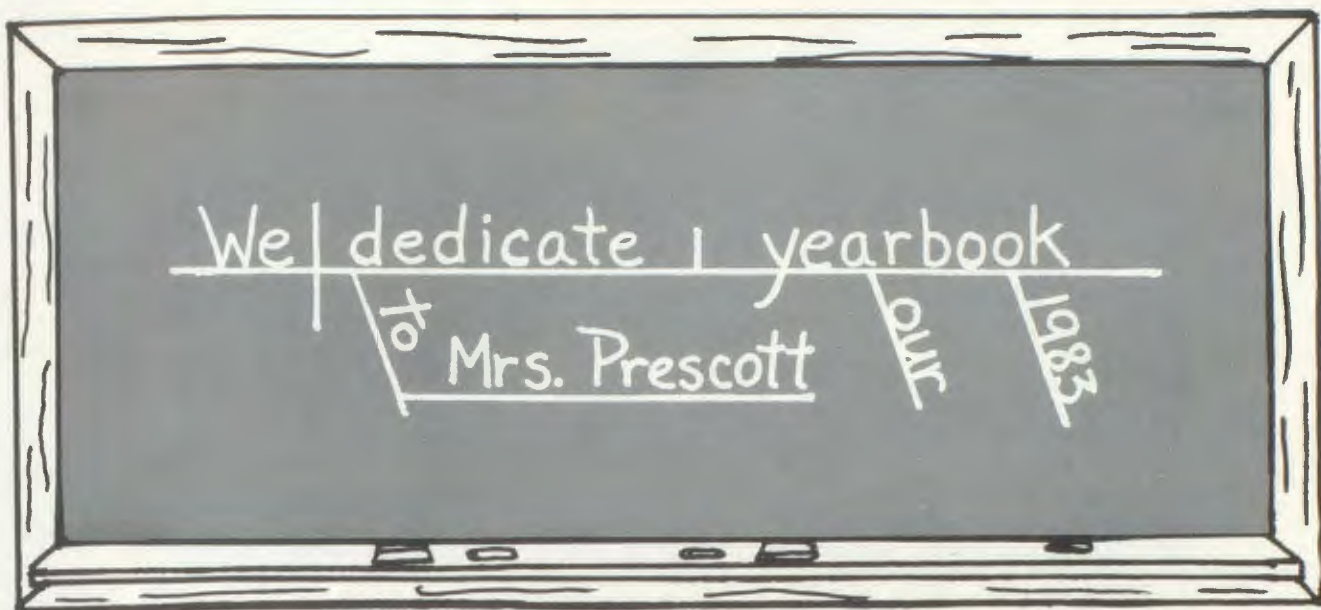


Diagram that sentence! What animal would you associate with Tom Sawyer? Did you finish your family tree? How about your autobiography? Your next composition is due on Thursday.

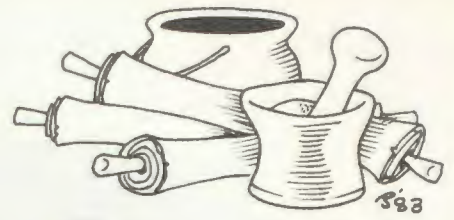


The Sophomore class knows what it takes to stay together. And nothing tested their ability to stay together more than the class ring fiasco.

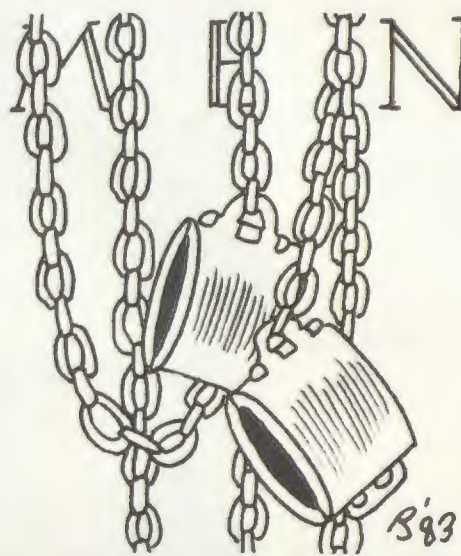
Freshman Day and the Freshman Resistance were the headliners for the freshman class this year. In their first year as members of the high school the freshman class made its mark.
