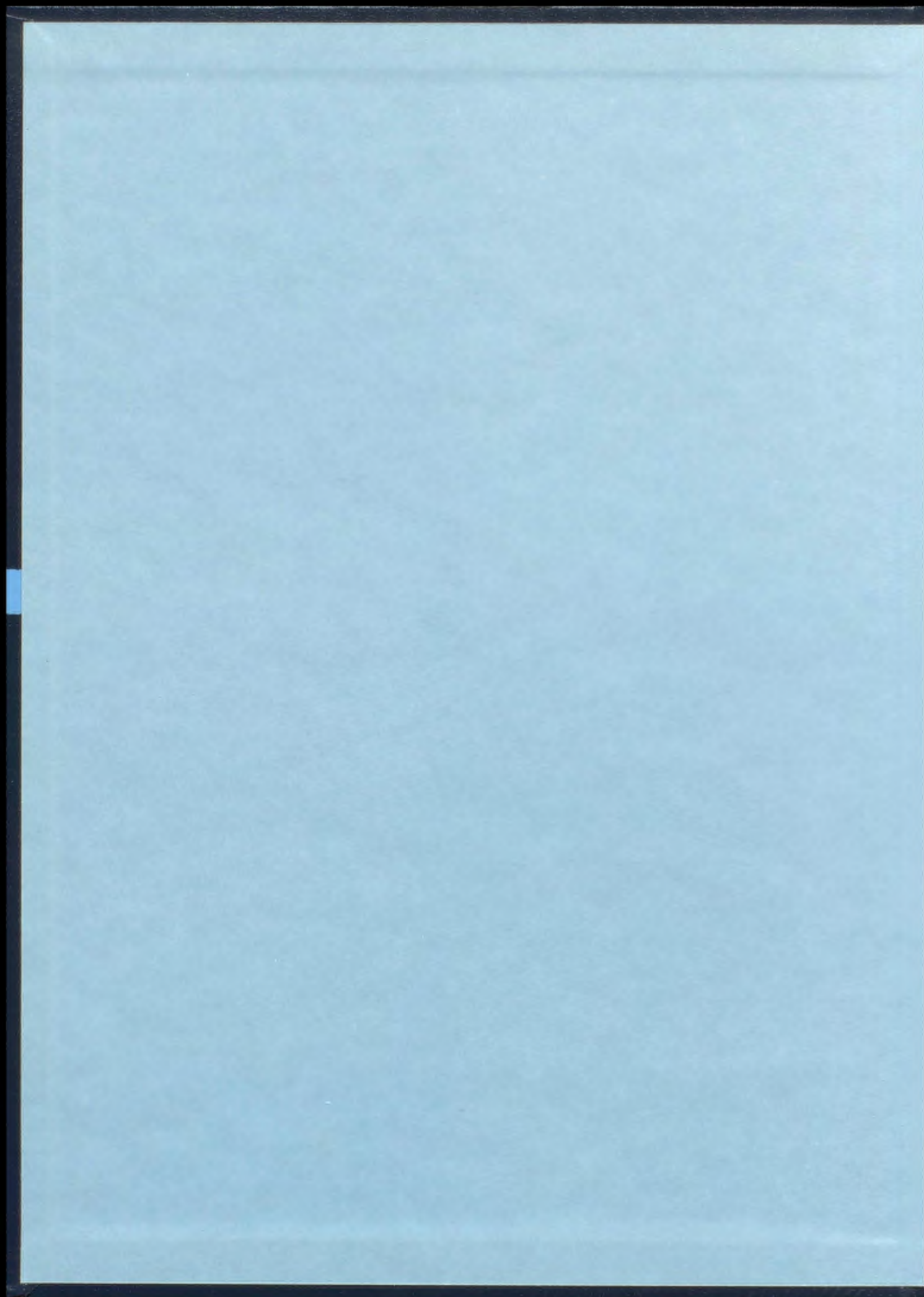



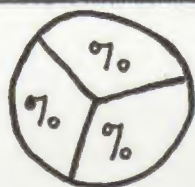
25 years have
