I never thought in my unknowing, unseeing mind that five bucks could ever bring me such happiness over a worn little hardwood chair.

A Note From Your Editors

From daton to dusk and September until June (including Saturdays), we work on the yearbook. No one spends this much time on homework: we must be cruzy! What, you ask, do we do? We select the format of the book, the order and length of sections, whether pages are in color or black and white, and we set the book price. During September and October, we run workshops for old and new staff. There's layout design. Page Maker, and Yeartech to muster, and all sorts of skills and procedures to learn. With our section hands we choose the cover and theme, develop design and layout ideas, and establish the ladder. Editors, section heads, and staff members all work on the 178 pages of the yearbook. Besides designing page languas on the computer, we write text and headlines, we take, select, crop, and label photos, and we collect survey responses, sports scores, and class, club and team rosters. We sell ads, run fund raising events, and argunize photo sessions with the MacLean-Stevens Studio. We laugh a lot, complain a lot, and have a youd time.

We ve met every Tuesday morning promptly at 7:30 a.m. and have everything under control.

By mid November, we think we have a problem. We're missing senior portraits, quotes and activities; we don t have enough soccer candids; no one has any softball or baseball photos, the superlative candids don't fit the layout, and we have ten days to meet the deadline. The senior section heads spend every night until 11:00 p.m. at VUHS and we make our first deadline. During December we spend afternoons and every weekend in the library; we hardy make the second deadline. We meet Tuesday mornings but are rarely on time. After the ice storm, we've really stressed and don't come close to making the deadline; our publisher is patient. We're now selling yearbooks during lunch, and our numbers have dwindled but a core group continues to work afternoons and weekends. By the end of February, we finally put it all together; we make the last deadline and begin receiving our proofs. Checking proofs is exciting but proofreading is painful. True-day morning meeting- are very infrequent.

It's April and our job won t be finished until the yearbooks are sold, the candids, senior pictures, and other photos have been returned and distributed, and the warbook files and supboards have been cleaned out. What a year! We hope you agree the 1998 Blue and White is worth all the effort of this war s staff. Thank you everyone!
