RECORD OF THE BASKETBALL SEASON

Although the Commodorettes began the 1957-1958 season on the "wrong foot" by dropping their first two encounters to Milton and BFA of St. Albans, the girls then proceeded to win 11 of their next 13 starts. The entire squad and coaches Gordon Ayer and Paul Healy are certainly to be congratulated for their untiring efforts.






