Language Club

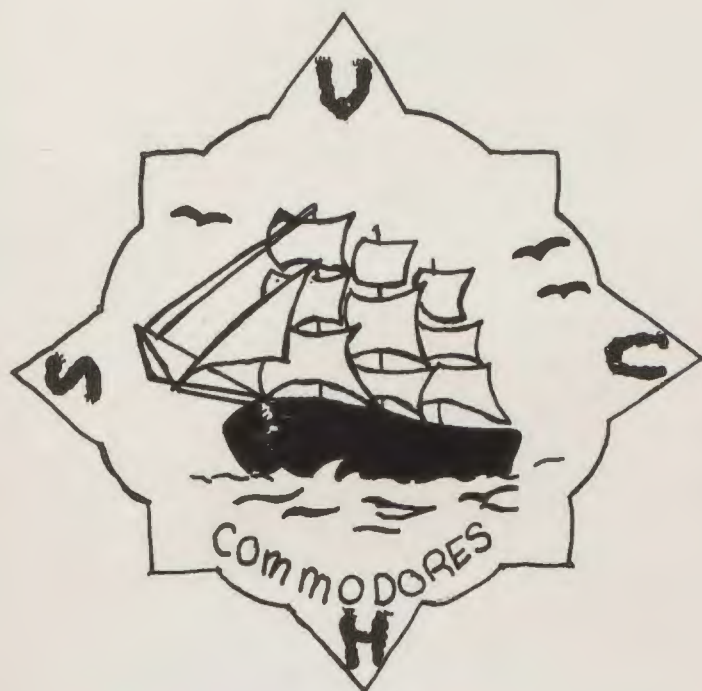
